Veterans Memorial Park A Sneak Peek

Construction on the new Veterans Memorial Park located off of Progress Parkway is well underway. You may have seen the lighting poles sprouting up and the red roof tops, easily spotted as you drive down Highway 50 heading east. Buildings, including dugouts, restrooms, shelters and a concession stand are nearing completion. The splash park is being installed. Walkways and parking lots are being



poured. The 43 acre park will include soccer/football fields, baseball fields, walking trails and natural areas, including a pond. Veterans Memorial Park is scheduled to open in the Spring of 2017.

Prairie Dell Road
Phase 2. A continuation of the Prairie Dell
Road improvement
project, it involves widening Prairie Dell Road
from Audry Lane, south
to College Road and
adding curbs and sidewalks. During con-

struction, the road is partially closed, allowing only oneway traffic going south. Directions to the detour at Progress Parkway are posted. Estimated completion is late Fall 2016.

Judith Spring Road Bridge Replacement. According to the Missouri Department of Transportation, the bridge had the lowest sufficiency rating of any bridge in Union. Crews are replacing the bridge and realigning the road. Estimated completion is early July 2016.

Old Highway 50/Springfield Road. Shoulder widening on the south side of Old Highway 50, west of Independence Drive will begin soon. Plans call for a Phase 2 to extend widened shoulders and adding handicap accessible sidewalks east to Main Street.

Over the eastern horizon of Union, large cranes can be seen at the construction site of Volpi Foods in the Union Corporate Center. Volpi Foods makes dry-cured meats and other specialties using artisan techniques that originated in Italy. The City is delighted Volpi chose Union for their expansion project and look forward to this significant addition to the Union community.

Under the direction of Public Works Director, Harold Lampkin, they are responsible for ensuring that city vehicles are available, dependable, cost effective, energy efficient, and safe to operate. They provide scheduled maintenance to reduce overall vehicle operating costs, minimize downtime, and extend useful life.

The department maintains and repairs 50 city-owned vehicles, including police cars, as well as over 80 pieces of large and small equipment. By performing this work in-house, the City saves over 60% in vehicle and equipment maintenance and repair.
