from the Mayor As we head into 2018 the year promises

As we head into 2018 the year promises to be another busy one. As you have probably noticed, the City recently completed work on the City Lake improvement project in cooperation with the Missouri Department of Conservation. The new floating dock and jetties will allow for greater accessibility for fishing throughout the lake once the new fishery has been established.



Fishing will not be allowed at the City Lake until November 2018 when trout will be stocked for winter fishing.

For those eager to fish in the spring and summer, the lake at St. Andrews and Denmark Rd. is open. Veterans Memorial Park lake may be stocked in the future for individual fishing derbies which will be advertised at that time.

The City continues to work on several roadway and sidewalk improvements throughout the City. Construction on Denmark Road has begun and will be completed later this year. As you drive through these areas, pay particular attention to construction zones, lane changes, and road closures. I realize it may be inconvenient, but as we've seen, the finished projects are well worth the temporary inconvenience.

Winter Weather Reminder

When winter weather hits, our Street Department begins the process of plowing and salting to keep our streets safe for travel. Keep in mind, streets are cleared on priority:

- 1. Main primary arteries, dangerous hills, bridges and schools
- 2. Side streets and subdivisions
- 3.End streets and cul-de-sacs (separate smaller plow truck is used)

We do our best to clear every street in a timely manner but in heavy, continuous weather conditions we must focus on the heavily traveled streets/main thoroughfares in the city.

During snow events, the City frequently receives calls from residents asking why snow plows leave snow deposited at the end of their driveways or on sidewalks. Snow plows are designed to push snow to the side. Snow then is deposited at the end of driveways and on sidewalks as a byproduct of plowing streets. Drivers tend to plow at low speeds to minimize this issue, but this problem becomes more challenging to avoid with greater accumulations of snow.

Union Corporate Center New Home to Heat and Control

The skyline in east Union has dramatically changed in the last year or so with the addition of Veterans Memorial Park and the new industries in the Union Corporate Center.

Heat and Control recently completed construction of a 103,000 square foot facility on a 13.32 acre site on the south side of the Union Corporate Center. They plan to occupy the building in



December 2017. Heat & Control manufactures equipment for coating seasoning and flavoring application for food. They currently have 50-60 employees and expect to expand to over 100 in years to come. The company participated with the City and the developer, Union Development Corporation, in applying for a Community Development Block Grant to assist in financing the completion of Corporate Drive.
