




from the mayor

I'd like to start off this letter by sending my thoughts and prayers to the people of Maryland Heights, Bridgeton and especially the people of Joplin. Over these past few months, Mother Nature has unleashed her fury upon Missouri and caused millions of dollars in damage and shattered lives and communities. In due time, these communities will rebound from the destruction stronger than before with community bonds that can never be destroyed. I'm pleased to share with you that the City of Union was able to send a crew of 4 City employees to assist in the search and rescue. Once again, I'd like to express how proud I am of these City employees and their desire to help their fellow Missourians.



In April, the City of Union proposed a sales tax increase of ½ % for the development of the park property the City purchased along Progress Parkway and the maintenance of current park property. Unfortunately, this proposal was not passed. By using a sales tax as a vehicle to develop the park, we capture those people outside the city limits that utilize our parks and do not pay property taxes. The Board of Aldermen and I are committed to the development of this project and the park system here in Union. We believe, as a Board, that an established and well maintained park system increases the quality of life for our citizens of ALL ages. Kevin Arand, Union Parks Director, and his staff, have worked tirelessly over the past couple of years to catch up with maintenance issues in the parks and to expand programming offerings.

One reason for the City's need for more parks is the U.S. Census Bureau released their population figures and Union now has a population of over 10,000. Our population now sits at 10,204. So, our needs for more ball fields, soccer fields, walking trails, etc. are growing and will continue to grow in the years to come.

Also with growth comes construction, and we have it happening all over town. A larger water line has recently been installed along sections of Main Street in preparation of our Main Street project. Construction continues on the expansion of the Denmark Road Sewage Treatment Facility and lift station along Highway 47 South. In 2013, Denmark Road from Progress Parkway to St. Andrews Drive is scheduled for widening and the possible installation of sidewalks. I ask you to please drive carefully and keep an eye out for construction workers.

As always, City Board of Aldermen meetings and Committee meetings are open to the public and your input is always appreciated and welcome...this is YOUR city.





Department Focus



The **City of Union Engineering/Building Department** has a range of responsibilities; many of which can affect the City for years into the future. The three people who make up the Department are responsible for building code enforcement, project planning (infrastructure), planning and zoning and many "other duties as assigned."

The Engineering Department is made up of three individuals and they are lead by Jonathan Zimmermann, City Engineer, a Union High School graduate who attended East Central College then University of Missouri – Rolla and has been employed by the City since 2000. Jonathan is a Licensed Missouri Engineer.

Kevin Scheer, Building Inspector, has been with the City for approximately 17 years, beginning in the Public Works Department. Kevin has been in the position of Building Inspector since 2003 and has attended numerous courses to stay fresh of the many changes in the area of construction. In addition to reviewing submitted engineer/architectural drawings, Kevin must inspect buildings during construction and upon completion; this also includes larger retail and industrial buildings.

Donna Kossmann has been with the department for 11 years as Engineering Assistant and processes all incoming permits (flood, building, excavating, water/sewer), issues water meters, schedules building inspections and inputs data as needed.

As City Engineer, Jonathan must anticipate the City's growth for several years out and coordinate with various regional, state and federal governmental entities and agencies to secure funding. These projects can be a wide range of infrastructure needs, such as; upgrading of the City's sewer system, replacement of water lines and, most importantly, major transportation needs. Jonathan attempts to stretch the City's dollar as far as possible by accessing funds from other agencies, such as East-West Gateway Council of Governments in St. Louis, our regional transportation funding agency. One project that featured funding from several different agencies was the widening of Highway 50. Fifty percent was funded by MODoT, while the remainder was funded by grants sponsored by East West Gateway, Franklin County Government and the City of Union. Other projects that have been the responsibility of the City Engineer in the past 10 years have been the expansion of the two Union sewage treatment facilities, and the Washington Avenue and Church Street improvement projects.

As you can see, the Engineering/Building Department has a talented, devoted and competent staff which will keep our growing community prepared for tomorrow.


